Orientation to Mercy 8 Module Program (self-paced)

Accredited by MACS, CESA and CEWA Modules can be used as a full program or stand alone



This 8 Module Program is updated each year (most recently in January 2025) and is accredited for 6 hours by Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS) for those completing all 8 Modules (Accreditation also includes educators working in the Ballarat, Sale and Sandhurst Dioceses in Victoria) via the TAP.

Accreditation has also been approved by CESA for educators in South Australian Catholic schools and by CEWA for educators working in Western Australian Catholic schools. Some school staff groups have engaged in Module 1 as a 'stand-alone' whole staff formation opportunity. Other Modules, such as Modules 3 and 4 which explore the Works of Mercy, could be done in a similar way. Staff new to Mercy-heritage schools have also worked in small groups with a mentor when undertaking the 8 Modules for Accreditation.
