October Reflection: An ongoing story that began with one child

One of the many rewarding aspects of supporting the formation programs for Mercy Ministry Companions has been the opportunity to meet staff across the ministries and other Mercy heritage Ministerial Public Juridic Persons (MPJPs). In October, I had the pleasure of attending site visits arranged for Group 2 as part of the 2025 *Middle Leadership: Empowering Middle Leaders* program offered in Western Australia.

On Friday, 17 October, we began our day with a tour of Mercedes College – Ursula Frayne's first school, founded in 1846. Our guide, Vedette Lendich, Director of Faith & Mercy Charism, Mercedes College Perth, shared the remarkable story of the school's opening: despite Ursula being told, before she left for Australia, that hundreds of children needed education, only one child arrived at the beginning of the first day, with five more arriving during the day. Undeterred, Ursula and her sisters took to the streets, encouraging families to send their children. Slowly numbers increased and the school's legacy began to take root.

Mercy Education 2025 Frayne Speech Festival

On Friday 29 August, students from across Mercy Education schools gathered at the Mary Moloney Theatre at Sacred Heart College, Kyneton for the 2025 Frayne Speech Festival – honouring Mother Ursula Frayne, a pioneering Sister of Mercy and founder of Mercedes College, Perth: the first Mercy school in Australia.

Now in its 29th year, the festival featured three categories: Public Speaking, Debating, and Voice Choir. Students explored contemporary issues including politics and government, environment and sustainability, technology and ethics, and the power of play.

Sacred Heart College Kyneton Principal Dr Darren Egberts said "In a world overflowing with communication, it's easy to mistake volume for value. The Frayne Speech Festival provides a platform to return to what matters: listening, understanding, and embracing different perspectives that challenge, inspire, and connect us."

McAuley's Car Park Sleepout at Melbourne Airport

On 16 October, McAuley partnered with Melbourne Airport and Juno for the 2025 Car Park Sleepout, raising vital funds and awareness for those facing homelessness due to family violence. Sleeping in their cars on the T4 car park rooftop, 130 participants were offered a small glimpse into the vulnerability and uncertainty women and children face when forced to leave their homes in search of safety. Those who took part were privileged to hear about this directly from people with lived experience, including McAuley's Lived Experience Advisor, Diana Connell, who courageously shared her stories. The event raised more than \$90,000 for McAuley and Juno.



Mercy Connect Celebrates Mercy Day 2025

Mercy Connect teams celebrated Mercy Day in the final week of September, taking time to pause and appreciate the incredible contributions of staff, participants, and community, and to reaffirm the values that guide their work: dignity, respect, inclusion, and kindness. 

Mercy Health Drives Sustainable Healthcare

With support from the Mercy Health Foundation, four team members from Mercy Health's sustainability, quality improvement, infection prevention and control, and pharmacy teams recently participated in the University of Melbourne's Sustainability in Quality Improvement (SusQI) Workshop: aiming to integrate environmental sustainability into healthcare quality improvement.

Mercy Health is now working to embed SusQI principles into its existing improvement framework, helping staff consider and measure the environmental, social and financial impacts of their initiatives. Team members are now applying their learnings to tackle some of healthcare's most pressing sustainability challenges including reducing unnecessary glove use, cutting waste from expired medical consumables, rethinking inhaler use and building capability for sustainable quality improvement.
